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Why Choose to Study BTEC Music at Shelley College?



Course Outline


Students study four units across the 2-year course.

In Year 12

- Unit 1 Practical Music Theory and Harmony
 - **Unit 2** Professional Practice in The Music Industry.

In Year 13

- **Unit 3** Ensemble Performance
 - Unit 6 Solo Performance



Unit 1 - Practical Music Theory and Harmony

- Develop your understanding of the signs and symbols associated with the notation of pitch, rhythm, tempo, dynamics and expression.
- Demonstrate your knowledge through performance, using chords and progressions accurately, and composition, deepening your understanding of the music you perform.

Unit 2 - Professional Practice in The Music Industry

- Learn how to put forward a bid for work with an understanding of the qualities industry professionals expect.
- From planning festivals, to album launches, to creating content for a promotional tour; you will gain an understanding of the diversity of the music industry and how to work within it.

Unit 3 – Ensemble Performance

- Develop essential skills for being a musician, from rehearsal techniques to performances.
- You will have many opportunities to perform and develop leadership skills through directing rehearsals and organising events.
- Create covers of songs in a variety of genres including rock, reggae, punk and swing.

<u>Unit 6 – Solo Performance</u>

- Explore and practice specific skills associated with performing as a soloist.
- Perform to an audience.
- Develop your stage presence and create appropriate set lists.
- Gain technical skills from visiting professionals in workshops tailored to your individual needs.

Enrichment Opportunities

Whilst studying BTEC Music, several of our students take part in musical enrichment activities which provide students with additional skills and experience to their qualifications.

This BTEC course can lead to many different destinations in higher education for a range of courses.

Several past students have gone on to study music courses at the University of Chester, Huddersfield University, BIMM and Leeds Conservatoire (previously Leeds College of Music).

However, students have also left to study Mathematics, Social Work and Psychology, amongst other subjects at university.
